Before & After Stonewall: The Making of a Gay and Lesbian Community. Dir. Greta Schiller and Robert Rosenberg. First Run Features, 2010. Film.

Two documentaries explore LGBT history. Before Stonewall explores the history of homosexuality in America through historical footage from 1920s–1960s and includes interviews with those who lived through it. After Stonewall chronicles lesbian and gay life from the 1969 Stonewall riots through 1999, especially how AIDS changed the direction of the movement.
