During **Bookmark Bunch: Family Book Discussion**, you and your family read the book *From the Mixed-Up Files of Mrs. Basil E. Frankweiler*, by E. L. Konigsburg, and meet weekly with other families to discuss it.

If you enjoy crafting and have unfinished projects, then you may want to sign up for the **Pro-Craft-inators Accountibility Club**. This online program provides space for encouragement from other crafters and, if you're stuck, assistance from crafty librarians.

Other library programs taking place in January include weekly **Storytimes**, **Introduction to Dominican Bachata**, **LEGO Free Play**, **Green Screen Cinema Magic**, and **3D Printing Drop-in Hours**.
