Spokane, WA | December 26, 2023 – Spokane County Library District (SCLD) announces the events, workshops, and activities happening in January at its libraries and online.

Those with self-care as a resolution can start the year by making an herbal tub sachet and learning about ways to unwind, relax, and take care of themselves during the online program: **The Science of Self-Care**. They can also sign up for the in-person **New Year Self-Care Retreat**, which is also offered in Spanish: **Retiro de autocuidado: Recibiendo el año nuevo**.

For anyone thinking about sprucing up their houseplant collection, the **Indoor Plant Swap** is a great way to find something new. Also, Master Gardener Steve Nokes shares the proper ways for **Pruning & Planting Fruit Trees**. Adults and teens can prepare for spring gardens while growing their technical skills during **3D Printing: Micro-Seed Starter Pots**.

Other workshops and events for exploring a favorite hobby or new interest include **Sing Along with Just Plain Darin**, **World Cooking: Colombian Food**, **Genealogy Drop-in Sessions**, and **Fix It Together**.

The first ever **LEGO Stop-Motion Movie Screening & Celebration** takes place on Saturday, January 20, 4:15–5:45pm at Spokane Valley Library (22 N Herald Rd). See what creators of all ages from the region have put together to share with us.

If starting a business is top of mind, the **How to Start a Business** workshop presented by a SCORE business mentor will help you explore business startup considerations, including questions about legal issues, taxes, insurance, and funding.
