Full STEAM ahead with library programs in April

Spokane, WA / March 28, 2023 – Spokane County Library District announces its lineup of April programs for children, teens, adults, and nonprofit organizations.

During STEAM (science, technology, engineering, arts, and math) programs, kids can explore the wonders of **flight**, **optical illusions**, **electrical circuits**, **robots**, and more. They can also create **Koinobori Carp Windsocks**, **Peeps Dioramas**, and **Bloxel video games**. Most of these programs don't require registration.

Other programs include **LEGO Free Play**, **Storytimes**, the family book discussion program **Bookmark Bunch**, **Object Creation for Augmented Reality**, crafting **Tub Teas**, and more! See all of the programs for early learners, kids, tweens, and teens at www.sclcd.org/kids-april.

Programs for adults include creative crafts and activities such as **Japanese Sashiko** stitching and **Blacksmithing at the Library**. **Author Talks** with best-selling writers, **genealogy** classes, **gardening** topics, and **tips for reading with kids** are also in the lineup for April, along with health and well-being programs such as **Chair Yoga**, the **Tuesday Memory Café** program, and **hikes** around Medical Lake and the Little Spokane River in Dartford.

Financial education is the focus for several programs, including **Estate Planning Basics** and **Medicare Summary Notices & Explanation of Benefits**. Adults can sign up for appointments to get assistance completing and filing federal taxes during **Free AARP Tax Aide** and also with submitting the application for the **Washington Families Tax Credit**.

During **Virtual Book Club in Spanish**, Spanish-speaking adults discuss the final chapters of *El coronel no tiene quien le escriba*.

For those thinking about or in the early stages of starting a nonprofit organization, the **Building a Sustainable Nonprofit** workshop, presented by a SCORE Spokane mentor, will help them learn the steps involved to set the stage for long-term success.
